### Readings for the Third Sunday of Easter

#### First Reading Acts of the Apostles 5:27-32,40b-41

The apostles are brought before the Sanhedrin and ordered to stop speaking in Jesus' name.

#### Responsorial Psalm Psalm 30:2,4,5-6,11-12,13

A song of praise to God who rescues us.

#### Second Reading Revelation 5:11-14

John describes his vision of the praises that will be sung to the Lamb by every creature on heaven and earth.

#### Gospel Reading

John 21:1-19 (short form: John 21:1-14)

Jesus appears to the disciples for a third time after his Resurrection and shares a meal with them.

The disciples have brought to shore a tremendous catch of fish that Jesus has directed them to find. But once on the shore, they see that Jesus has already prepared fish and bread on a charcoal fire. Jesus directs the disciples to bring their catch of fish as well. Jesus is host at the meal that follows, feeding the disciples the bread and fish. In this detail we see allusions to the miracle of the multiplication of the loaves and the fishes told in John 6.

There are also allusions in the Gospel to our gathering for the celebration of the Mass. In the Eucharist, we too are fed by Jesus in the bread and wine that have become his very Body and Blood. We also find in this story insight about the Presentation of the Gifts at Mass. The gifts we bring to the altar, bread and wine, are made from gifts that God gave first to us: grain and grapes, the fruit of the earth. God has no need of anything further. Yet God accepts the offering we bring—bread and wine, “the work of human hands”—and transforms our offering into the gift of his very presence.

DESPUÉS de una noche de pesca estéril, los discípulos vuelven a la orilla cansados y decepcionados, con las redes vacías. En ese momento, ven en la playa al Señor resucitado, pero no lo reconocen inmediatamente. Como había sucedido tres años antes, en el inicio de su vocación, Jesús les invita otra vez a echar las redes. Durante este encuentro pascual, al final del camino terrenal con sus discípulos, Jesús renueva la invitación que Pedro había también escuchado en el mismo lago: «Guía mar adentro, y echad vuestras redes para la pesca» (Lc 5,4).

La imagen de la barca y de las redes evoca la misión de la Iglesia. Como le sucedió a Pedro y al resto de sus compañeros, también nosotros estamos en la barca de la Iglesia para extender la luz de Cristo. Es una invitación constante para adentrarnos en el mar de la historia, y echar las redes con generosidad y valentía. «Todos los mares son nuestros —decía san Josemaría—. Donde la pesca es más difícil, es también más necesaria». Para superar las dudas e incertidumbres que podamos atravesar en este mar, necesitamos reconocer a Jesús, que es quien nos espera en la orilla. Así se remos conscientes de que el gran bien que podemos ofrecer a los demás es precisamente el encuentro con el Señor. «Nada puede producir mayor satisfacción que el llevar tantas almas a la luz y al calor de Cristo».

Los peces, creados para vivir en el agua, mueren al sacarlos del mar. Sin embargo, en la misión del pescador de hombres ocurre justo lo contrario. La red de Cristo nos rescata de las aguas de la muerte y nos lleva a la vida verdadera. «Hace falta sacar a los hombres del mar salado por todas las alienaciones y llevarlos a la tierra de la vida, a la luz de Dios (...). Únicamente donde se ve a Dios, comienza realmente la vida».
